Connecting School and Home Through Learning Activities

Thank you for allowing me to spend time with Loren. She is cheerful, funny, and loves learning. Also, Loren loves board games, hands-on activities, and setting goals.

During our tutoring sessions, Loren demonstrated considerable strengths through segmenting individual sounds in words and blending consonants with short vowels.



Reading Support 1: Long-e Vowel Teams

Loren practiced reading and recognizing long-e vowel teams, (e.g., ie, ee, ea), in one-syllable words. The more exposure she gets with this vowel pattern and structure will support Loren's steps towards reading multi-syllable words.

Activity 1: Pictures and Reading Words Matching Game

Loren loves timed games and setting goals. Using note cards or Online printouts, create a word stack with the long-e vowel pattern words and a stack of matching pictures.

- 1. Place the word and matching visual card face down and set a one-minute timer.
- 2. Have her flip the cards to create an image and word match. Next, have her read the word.
- 3. When the timer goes off, count her matches and allow her to set a matching goal for the next round.

Activity 2: Vowel Team Bingo!



This game will help Loren identify the long-e vowel teams in words.

- 1. Create or print blank bingo cards and write the long-e vowel teams in the bingo squares.
- 2. On note cards write one-syllable words that correspond with the long-e vowel teams, (e.g., speech, thief, lead).
- 3. Allow Loren to read the word card during each turn, say the letters in vowel team, and identify the location, (beginning, middle, or end), of the vowel team within the word.
- 4. Take turns placing markers on each of the bingo cards.
- 5. The first person with a vowel team bingo wins!

Reading Support 2: Multi-Syllable Words Activity 3: Online Game - "SILLYBULLS"

While Loren practiced her vowel teams, we slowly added multi-syllable words to help her break down words into manageable parts. The Online game, "SILLYBULLS," audibly reads single-and multi-syllable words. Next, the player must re-read, break down, and sort words into the number of syllables category.

This multi-sensory game will help Loren use her skills to practice reading multi-syllable words and vowel teams.
